A federally funded program that provides supplemental support with reading for students in grades K-5.

How Are Title I Funds Spent?

Title I provides funding for:

- Title I teachers/Reading Specialists
- Literacy Aides
- Teaching Materials and Resources
- Parent Involvement Activities
- Training for Teachers



How Does Title I Help My Child?

- Provide supplemental small group reading instruction
- Provide instructional materials
- Assist students to be successful on MAP testing and SOL tests
- Inspire students to develop a life-long love of learning!

The Goals Of Title I Are:

- Helping students succeed in school
- Helping students to read on or above grade level
- Helping students achieve growth on MAP and SOL tests
- Helping students develop a life-long love of learning!

How Can I Help My Child?

- Make sure your child participates in school daily and arrives on time for virtual and in-person learning.
- Establish a homework routine.
- Talk with your child's classroom teacher and Title I teachers.
- Attend parent involvement activities at CES.
- Take your child to the public library.

How Can I Help My Child? (cont.)

- Read to your child and have your child read to you.
- Play learning games and board games with your child.
- Limit television and computer "screen time" beyond school instruction.
- Use time wisely in the car (talk, play memory games, listen to books on CD, etc...)
